We follow the Church's desire that outside Lent and Advent, Baptisms take place during Sunday Mass (Ritual intro., rubric 9).

<u>Christmas Liturgy Reminder for Guests</u> To avoid embarrassing moments with your Christmas guests during the Christmas liturgies, please read and observe the "Guidelines for Receiving Communion in the Catholic Church" from the Catholic Bishops, found on page 234 of the "Breaking Bread" hymnal.

<u>Inclement Weather</u> When school is closed due to bad weather, daily Mass will be postponed until 10:30 a.m. Please be responsive to the weather conditions where you live. Just because we have Mass does not obligate you to attend Mass when the weather or illness physically impedes you from leaving your home. Missing Mass for illness or dangerous travel conditions in not a sin. Thank you.

IN CASE OF ILLNESS If you are running a fever or experiencing a productive cough, please receive Holy Communion under Consecrated Host alone. Please refrain from receiving the Blood of Christ. Remember that the Second Vatican Council out of which comes our Catechism of the Catholic Church §1377, makes no alteration or relaxation of the Council of Trent and the Fathers of the Church in the dogma on the Eucharist: Christ is present whole and entire in each of its species [Host and Precious Blood], in each of their parts, so that the breaking of the bread does not divide Christ. After receiving the Sacred Host your self-denial of the chalice will be recognized by our Lord in heaven as imitative of his humility and charity, and regarded as considerate on earth among the people sharing the Sacrifice of the Mass with you.

CHURCH SECURITY AND DOOR LOCKS - The pastoral and finance councils have consulted with law enforcement to form a plan for emergency evacuations of the church. This is in accordance with diocesan safety policies. Generally, the ushers, who have graciously and deliberately taken on this responsibility, will be the persons to direct us to the nearest exits, which will vary depending upon the incident, whether it is related to severe weather, fire, or assault on the assembly. A signaling system has been established. When we see an action or hear a sound not usually seen and heard during the liturgy, that means that an emergency is being signaled, and we are to look for the ushers to give us evacuation instructions, and the celebration of Mass will be suspended until further notice.

Further, as a way of limiting access to potential assaulters upon the premises during the liturgy, once the Mass has begun with the entrance song, the only access into the church will be the Third Street doors, which the ushers will monitor. This action will still allow emergency exit from inside the church, through all the exterior doorways available to the assembly. At weekday school Masses, this plan has been in effect for over a month, and based on its reception, we think it is a good time for everyone to become familiar with the plan for its use during the Sunday liturgies.

Signs will be posted at the side doors of the church – the door from the parking lot and alley with the hall and the door from Ira Street, advising anyone arriving after the beginning of Mass to use the Third Street entrance.

The accommodations for carrying out the emergency plan will go into effect on the weekend of Saturday and Sunday, December 21-22 2019. ~ Father Rolando
